Toledo, OH – Today, United Way of Greater Toledo (UWGT) announced its 2016-17 program investments. Through the generosity of the local community, more than \$10.7 million will be invested in programs, initiatives, and partnerships advancing education, income and health throughout Lucas, Wood, and Ottawa counties.

“We applaud the generosity of all our donors, corporate and individual, and our volunteers who are so committed to building community everyday,” said Karen Mathison, president and CEO of United Way of Greater Toledo. “Our investments fuel the community to advance in education, income, and health.”

Linda Ewing, United Way of Greater Toledo 2015-2016 board chair explained, “The resources awarded to organizations for specific programming align with United Way’s 5-year Live United 2020 goals. We have a solid investment plan in top-performing, local programs and initiatives which through positive results make our community a better place to live, work, and raise a family.”

The United Way Board of Directors approved the investment recommendations of community volunteers, who over the course of several months, reviewed program results, completed site visits, and assessed the programs’ ability to achieve the results needed to move the work forward.

Further reinforcing the collaboration between United Way and its organizational partners, Community Impact Awards were given to a number of United Way’s local non-profit partners for achieving outstanding results, demonstrating proactive responsiveness, and effective partnerships.

Community Impact Awards

Community Partnership Award:

- **Toledo Grows**, a program of Toledo Botanical Garden, known for implementing best practices in community engagement, urban agriculture, volunteer management and meaningful impact. Much of their success can be attributed to their strong and ever-growing collaborative partners.
- **The Ottawa County Business Advisory Council** created job shadowing, internships and apprenticeships for the 5,485 students in the 6 school districts in Ottawa County. A team of educators and employers are designing opportunities for students to do career exploration from something as simple as visiting a workplace to a 6-8 week internship that results in a stipend at the end.

Impact Results Award:

- **Toledo Public School’s Partners with Purpose and Girl Scouts of Western Ohio;** together have begun to report student attendance at programs. This serves as a means to dig deeper into the data to engage in continuous improvement with the students.

Impact Responsiveness Award:

- **Schools as Community Hub sites** for diligence in engaging the schools’ community members to discover their aspirations and hopes that drive the necessary work. Those schools and their lead partners include:
 - Leverette Elementary and YMCA/JCC
 - Pickett Academy and the University of Toledo

- Reynolds Elementary and University Church
- Robinson Elementary and The University of Toledo
- Scott High School and Lutheran Social Services
- **Toledo Lucas County Health Department** for positive response to the issue of high infant mortality and creating partnerships to bring CenteringPregnancy to our community as an additional tool to reach at-risk mothers.
- **Wood County Educational Service Center's STARS Program** that provides quality enrichment and extended learning activities for elementary children in Wood & Ottawa counties. The STARS program expanded in the 2015-16 school year to meet the needs of families in the school districts of Eastwood (Pemberville) and Bowling Green (Conneaut).
